III. Principal's Report (Mrs. Goudelias)

- a. Thank you: gala committee and newspaper committee
- b. **Rezo A Funding:** \$500K for technology from Justin Brennan and ordered new promethean boards for classrooms, but need ink for next year

- c. **Gina's Runner's Club:** Kids were able to run in Times Square at NYC Half. Grades 3-5 ran a mile and kids K-2 ran 2-3 blocks and all got medals and 5/18 will do Brooklyn Half marathon.
- d. HMH Into Reading Curriculum: Last month Superintendent Pretto heard our concerns last month and took some questions out so our last test module was smaller and less lengthy. This year will not be doing Saturday test preps because they're getting enough of it from the new programs.
- e. **Upcoming Workshops:** Funaro will do another workshop on state test and there's one on 3/20 (slides available after).
- f. **Parent conferences and publishing party:** Last week were the parent teacher conferences and we also had a successful book publishing where children shared their writing with parents.
- g. **After school enrichments:** NIA is NYS blended program and this year we'll see how much funding we get for NIA. This year we have over \$140K and are hoping to get more funds so more children can have access to NIA.
- h. **Surveys:** Complete them so we know what you're concerned about and what you're satisfied with.
- i. **Summer Rising:** going to be at PS 170 at 619 72nd St.
- j. **Buzzer at the door:** trying to get it switched so the entrance, doorbell, and camera are on the same side.
- k. **Recess:** Ms. Kruger will be taking volunteers for open streets now that weather is getting nicer. Met with supervisor of PE for the district and he helped us order some games and train school aides so there's organized play when they go outside.
- I. **School Aide:** Trying to hire another one.
- m. **Cafeteria Budget Cuts:** keeping salad bar and some of the food they cut they're bringing back.
- n. Elections 4/2: bagged lunch available in auditorium (hummus, sunflower seed butter)
- o. Repairs:
 - i. Roof: still have leaks so need to repair before children can play up there
 - ii. Lights: got approved for new LED lights.
- p. **Ms. Funaro Presentation:** will be shared after and presented more thoroughly on 3/20 morning 9am on Zoom link will be shared after PTA meeting.
 - i. **ELA grades 3 & 4:** 4/11 and 4/12 paper based testing, untimed.
 - 1. 3rd grade no more long response so the test is shorter.
 - 2. 4th grade will have the longer essay, but it's about being clear and concise
 - ii. **ELA grade 5:** 4/15 and 4/16 Computer-based testing, untimed, 1 lined scrap paper
 - iii. Math grades 3 & 4: 5/7 and 5/8 paper based testing, untimed.
 - 1. 3rd grade important to ask them to show their work, have use of ruler.
 - 2. 4th grade ruler and protractor permitted, but doesn't mean they'll need it.
 - iv. **Math grade 5:** line and graph paper, trying to encourage more use of graph paper and will be bringing it down to lower grades,
 - 1. Will have a reference sheet, ruler, protractor, but no calculator
 - v. **Science grade 5:** 5/15 no test last year, but now has moved from 4th to 5th grade and will be untimed computer test.
 - vi. **ENL:** 4/15 to 5/24 speaking and 5/13 to 5/24 for reading/writing/listening
 - vii. **ELA Prep**: no test prep because already doing it daily in HMH curriculum.
 - 1. Selection quizzes are open book multiple choice so children can re-read and find the evidence. Trying to get kids to slow down.
 - 2. Short response: Cite text and everything answered in ADD format (Answer Detail Detail).

- 3. Extended response for grades 4 and 5 practiced with performance task and homework.
- 4. Module assessment is a cold read plus short response.
- 5. Not a ton of independent reading time in class so it's important kids are reading for over 30 min at home as well.

viii. Math Prep:

- 1. Topic 1-4, 1-8, 1-12 benchmark assessment
- Exemplars, performance tasks, daily solve and share question, number tasks
- 3. At home (links to both resources available in presentations that will be emailed to families on 3/20):
 - a. Bounce Pages opens up camera and can hover over homework page and will link to video to show how to solve the problem.
 - b. Envision Family Resource Guide
- ix. **Science Prep:** test administered as written exam in spring of each school year starting in 2024 and consist of multiple choice and written response. In 3rd grade did life cycle investigation, 4th grade working on electricity investigation and 5th grade doing all four and doing it in class with friends.

x. Q &A:

- 1. Should my child practice typing? They're doing it in class already. They can use typing.com if they want and make it fun, but not really necessary because already doing it in class.
- 2. Will state tests impact my child's grades? No and also won't be released until next year.
- 3. Can we opt our children out from taking the exam? DOE requires you meet with principal before opting out.

VI. Parent Coordinator Report (Jennifer Kruger)

- **a. School survey** emphasized importance of taking this. Need student OSIS number, which is found on report card or parent DOE account. Email Jen if need help.
- b. Summer rising apply by 3/25. Rank additional schools because priority goes to children who currently take an enrichment program at the Summer Rising site. We and 5 others schools are doing it at PS 170 so our children will be lower on priority list, which is why it is important to add more schools and rank all 5 enrichments options, as well as look at other additional sites and add them to increase your chances of getting Summer Rising placement.
- c. **Kindergarten offers** released 3/27 posted on MySchools and any family who gets offer from 185 will get email from Helen Verveniotis. Middle school offers are going to be released 4/3. If having difficulty accessing from My Schools, Ms. Kruger can access it.
- d. **Open Streets** need 8 parent volunteers and 4 cars; thank you to Catherine Crabtree for organizing this in the fall, but moving forward sign ups will be through Ms. Kruger.
